
### 25 MW Solar Diversifying CWLP's Energy Portfolio

- 25 MW for 25 years from a new 100 MW solar farm to be built south of Chatham in Sangamon County
- Energy and capacity
- Situated near CWLP transmission lines
- Represents around 6.5% of City's load
- Secures clean energy at a reasonable cost and reduces what we would purchase at higher market price
